Open Enrollment and Annual Enrollment

The Jefferson Parish Public School System strives to provide our employees with high-quality and affordable healthcare options. JPPSS' 2017 Plan Year Open and Annual Enrollment periods provide employees the opportunity to elect, cancel, and make changes to their health and supplemental insurance coverage.

Open Enrollment will occur Monday, September 26, 2016 - Wednesday, November 2, 2016. During this time employees will elect or make changes to their supplemental (dental, vision, life, accident, cancer, flexible spending account, etc.) insurance coverage. Additionally, if an employee would like to move any of their coverage to pre-tax or post-tax status, this can be completed during Open Enrollment. **All employees that work 20 or more hours a week should complete Open Enrollment.**

Open Enrollment will take place at all JPPSS schools and central office sites. Employees can attend Open Enrollment at any site, but employees may have a longer wait time at a non-home location. Annual Enrollment is October 1, 2016 - November 15, 2016. During Annual Enrollment employees can elect or make changes to their Office of Group Benefits (OGB) health and life insurance coverage only. Employees only need to take action during Annual Enrollment if they desire to enroll in coverage or make changes to their Office of Group Benefits health insurance coverage. Additionally, employees enrolled in the Pelican HSA (health savings account) 775 plan must set a 2017 contribution amount.

Employees who need to enroll in coverage, elect a 2017 health savings account contribution amount, or make changes to their OGB health insurance coverage should make an appointment to visit the Insurance Department during Annual Enrollment. Please call 349-8564 to schedule an appointment. All appointments will be held at the Administration Building (501 Manhattan Blvd, Harvey, LA).

Photo identification (school ID, drivers' license, etc) is required for Open and Annual Enrollment. Please present your identification to the representative at the time of your enrollment.

All elections and changes made during Open Enrollment and Annual Enrollment will be effective Sunday, January 1, 2017. *Employees' current insurance coverage elections will continue until Saturday, December 31, 2016.*

ACTION ITEM Mars Rover Event at UNO

The University of New Orleans (UNO) is very excited to be hosting Siemens' half scale model of the Mars Curiosity Rover. Siemens worked with NASA to create an exact half-scale model of the Curiosity rover which is currently collecting scientific information on Mars. This is a rare opportunity (this is the first time the model has been to Louisiana) and UNO invites your school to visit on September 22 or September 23. The event will be held in the UNO University Center, building number 34 on the attached map.

Due to limited space, schools are asked to register a maximum of two groups of thirty students in grades 6-12 (for a maximum of 60 students per school). To control the flow and maximize the experience of guests, a representative from your school must sign up for a time slot in this [SignUpGenius](#) to reserve your rover viewing time. The time slots are being reserved on a first-come, first-serve basis. In the SignUpGenius you will be prompted to include a contact name, phone number, and email address as well as the name of your school. Once you have reserved your time, a representative from UNO will email you for further details (# of students, grade levels, student drop-off and bus parking, etc).

Please arrive at least 30 minutes prior to your time slot to check in. Along with the Curiosity model there will also be STEM-focused exhibits and interactive demonstrations for students to explore either before or after the rover

CURRICULUM STANDARDS

Algebra I and Geometry EOCs and LA Student Standards for Mathematics

As you know, BESE voted to implement a Louisiana-specific set of standards for mathematics. All items on the EOCs will be fully aligned to these new standards. Please note that new standards added to geometry will not be assessed during the 2016-2017 school year. Instead, the LDOE will field-test questions relating to the new geometry standards this year before using them operationally.

Algebra I and Geometry EOC Assessment Guidance Update

The new assessment guides for these courses are scheduled to be released mid-September. Teachers can expect that these assessment guides will include all pertinent test design information. Though many aspects of the upcoming EOC tests will remain unchanged: sessions, points, percentages, etc., teachers should read the assessment guides carefully and note any changes to 2016-2017 algebra I and geometry test information.

Algebra I and Geometry EOC Calculator Guidance

Calculator designations are provided for each individual test item, not for particular standards. These EOC test items are reviewed by educator committees and these committees determine whether calculator usage will be allowed for that test item. Please note: calculator usage is always allowed on constructed-response type items.

High School Social Studies Act 469

In accordance with [Act 469](#), students enrolled in JPPSS civics classes are required to take the civics portion of the naturalization test used by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services. The test will be compiled at the district level, and copies will be distributed to all schools. Bubble sheets can be accessed on the PowerSchool site, formerly Interactive Achievement, and will be available for print the week prior to the start of the EOC testing window. Although it is not an EOC exam, the test will be administered during the EOC testing window and will count as a regular test grade. The Louisiana state department is in the process of reviewing and writing science standards for school districts in the state. In order to provide schools and teachers with the latest information regarding instruction and testing in science courses, the Louisiana Department of Education has stated that, "New science assessments will be created once the science standards revision process is completed. We anticipate the science standards revision work to begin this summer and continue through the school year. Given this timeline, we anticipate science field testing during 2017-2018. Biology EOCs will be revised once the standards revision process is completed, as well. Ultimately, the structure of the science assessments (grades 3 through HS) given in 2016-2017 will not be changing."

NOAA/NASA GOES-R Weather Satellite Launch

Launch is scheduled for **November 4** at 5:40 pm EDT. The launch of GOES-R will usher in a new era of satellite meteorology for National Weather Service scientists. GOES-R will include the first lightning mapper instrument. GOES-R will have the next generation imager, with more spectral bands and imaging the Earth five times faster than the current GOES. A 2-day teacher workshop and launch viewing will take place at KSC for the GOES-R launch, currently scheduled for November 4th, 2016. If the launch date changes the workshop dates will shift accordingly.

Grade Verification Process

During your planning period on Tuesday, September 20th, after you have entered all of your grades, please report to the counselors' area where one of the counselors will check Infinite Campus to see if indeed all of your grades have been entered. If all of your grades are in, they will check you out. This process can be done early, if you are ready. The window closes at noon on Wednesday, but the counselors have to run reports on Wednesday morning so we ask that **all grades are entered on Tuesday, September 20th**. If you have a problem completing this on Tuesday, please see Ms. Sharon Thomas.

TORNADO DRILL PROCEDURES

TORNADO TERMINOLOGY TO KNOW AND UNDERSTAND

TORNADO WATCH – A tornado weather forecast which does not mean that a tornado is coming, but that conditions are right for the development of a funnel system in an area which may include 10,00 to 390,000 miles.

TORNADO WARNING – an official “tornado warning” is issued by the Weather Bureau when a tornado has been sighted and persons in the “warning” area should seek shelter.”

PROCEDURES

When a tornado watch is announced, tornadoes are expected in or near our area, the school may have to have an all-out tornado drill, which is similar to, yet very different from a fire drill. It will be similar in that most students will be leaving their classrooms. It will be different in as much as the entire student body will be kept inside the building and kept in the portions of the building which are the most architecturally safe and sound.

The best protection from a tornado is underground shelters, but since these are not available at school, other places must be utilized.

Verbal instructions will be given during the “watch” period. Students will normally have time to prepare in advance, but everyone should be aware of the signal used and the necessary procedures to be followed.

Signal – LONG continuous bell. Verbal notification that this is a “TORNADO DRILL” will precede the signal.

After a TORNADO WARNING is issued, the entire student body will have to go to certain assigned places. Generally, the areas of the school which are most safe are the areas away from all windows and glass. Areas such as the gym with large roof areas are to be avoided.

TORNADOES cover such small areas that the chance of one striking the school is very slight but we must prepare. General instructions for a tornado drill are set forth below. These could be changed if the direction of the ensuing tornado was threatening one side of the building in particular.

Certain areas of the building are most exposed and susceptible to damage, generally those areas exposed on the South and West. Students and other personnel in these areas will leave their classrooms or stations and position themselves in the assigned areas.
