JCampus – Processing 1st Nine Weeks Grades 2017-18

Teacher Edition

All first nine weeks grades and comments **MUST** be entered in your WebGradeBook by 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, October 17 in compliance with the minimum number of grades required for the courses you teach. Teachers will not “post” grades as they have done in the past. Grades and comments will be automatically “capture” by the system at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, October 17.

At 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, October 17, Data Management will lock your access to your WebGradebook for the first nine weeks to preserve the integrity of the assignment records. After 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, October 17, teachers will no longer have the ability to enter grades in their WebGradebook for the first nine weeks.

Comments you selected for interim reports are still reflected in your WebGradebook and must be updated to reflect the nine weeks grades.

- To change an old comment, click on the old comment and select the replacement comment on the right.
- To delete an old comment, click on the old comment and click on the blank space above comment number 101.
- To make a new comment, click on an empty box to the right of the student’s name and click on the comment on the right.

Between Saturday, October 14 and 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, October 17, you will have WebGradebook access to both your first and second nine weeks courses. During this time, use caution in entering your nine weeks assignments and nine weeks grades into the *correct nine weeks marking period*.

Outdoor Classroom Activities – K. Torrado

You will receive a reply indicating whether or not your request to conduct you activity outdoors has been approved.

School-wide Performance Goals

- Increase EOC in all subjects by at least 5% points for the 17-18 school year.
- Increase ELL student performance levels on EOC (fall/spring) and ACT (c/o 18') examinations to meet District averages.
- Improve collaboration among professionals through the PLC whereas regular weekly meetings are held among department members, content-area teachers and support personnel in order to increase 2018 School Performance Score by at least 3 pts.

School-wide SMART Goals for EOC/LEAP 2025

Increase EOC/LEAP 2025 proficiency (Basic, Mastery, Advanced, Good, and Excellent) rates in all subjects by at least 5% for the 17-18 school year

To ensure attainment of school-wide SMART goals, teachers must adhere to the following guidelines when creating their SLTs:

Grace King Guidance for EOC/LEAP 2025 Teachers

If you teach the same course during the fall and spring semesters, you must write two (2) SLTs for all students enrolled in your course during both the fall and spring semesters.

- 1) For students scoring PROFICIENT (Good or Basic and above)
- 2) For students scoring at HIGH LEVELS OF PROFICIENCY (Excellent or Mastery and Advanced)

These will both be year-long SLTs, regardless of whether you teach a full year or semester course.

Grace King Guidance for Teachers Using Teacher Created Assessments (TCAs) – Humanities, Business, and non-EOC/LEAP 2025 Core Teachers

If you teach the same course during the fall and spring semesters, you must write two (2) SLT's for all students enrolled in your course during both the fall and spring semesters.

- 1) TCA whole-class (whole year)
- 2) Your second SLT must come from one of the following options:
 - TCA whole-class for a different course (whole year)
 - TCA small group (whole year)
 - ACT whole class (guidance pending)

Grace King Guidance for ESL Teachers, SPED Teachers, Health/PE Teachers, and Read 180 Teachers

If you teach the same course during the fall and spring semesters, you must write two (2) SLT's for all students enrolled in your course during both the fall and spring semesters. You should follow district guidance for these SLTs.

Protocol for Test Development Checklist

_____ Test design should be reflective of the types of standardized tests our students are expected to successfully complete e.g. LEAP 2025, EOC, LAA, AP, ACT, Workkeys, SAT (PSAT) and IBC. Test items must contain questions that promote critical and higher order thinking skills. Test items/questions should be aligned with college and work expectations. For this reason, teachers are encouraged to **collaborate** when designing tests and use LEAP 360, EAGLE, Common Core State Standards/Louisiana Students Standards (CCSS/LSS), GLE’s and IBC curriculum standards as a basis for designing high quality assessments. Final/Mid-term exams must be administered on the dates designated by JPSS. The essay portion of the exams may be administered no earlier than one week prior to JPPSS Fall/Spring Final Examinations dates.

_____ Title and Format

Tests shall be titled with your name, the exam term, the semester in which the exam is administered, the name of the course that you are teaching, and the period(s) in which the test applies.

All tests shall be typed, sectioned by type of question, and consistent in font size. Use bold or italic prints to emphasize specific content. Handwritten exams will not be accepted.

_____ Directions

Directions for taking each section of the test shall be written clearly.

_____ Questions and rationing points

Questions must reflect content taught – specifically, the standards that correspond with your course. Determine the content to be measured and assign weight accordingly. LEAP 2025/EOC teachers - please align the weight of your test items with the table of specifications found in the LEAP 2025/EOC assessment guide. Ensure that the greatest number of items and corresponding point values reflect the content that you wish to measure most and vice versa. All tests shall be developed to include the percentage of items as indicated in the table below, unless you are following the LEAP 2025/EOC, AP and IBC testing formats. When developing test(s) with multiple choice questions, be certain your assessment includes questions that are both easy and hard – measuring the student’s ability to recall information as well as their ability to reason and think critically. The number of points for each question shall be indicated next to each item or after the directions for each section. All exams must include at least one short answer, one constructed response item or an essay.

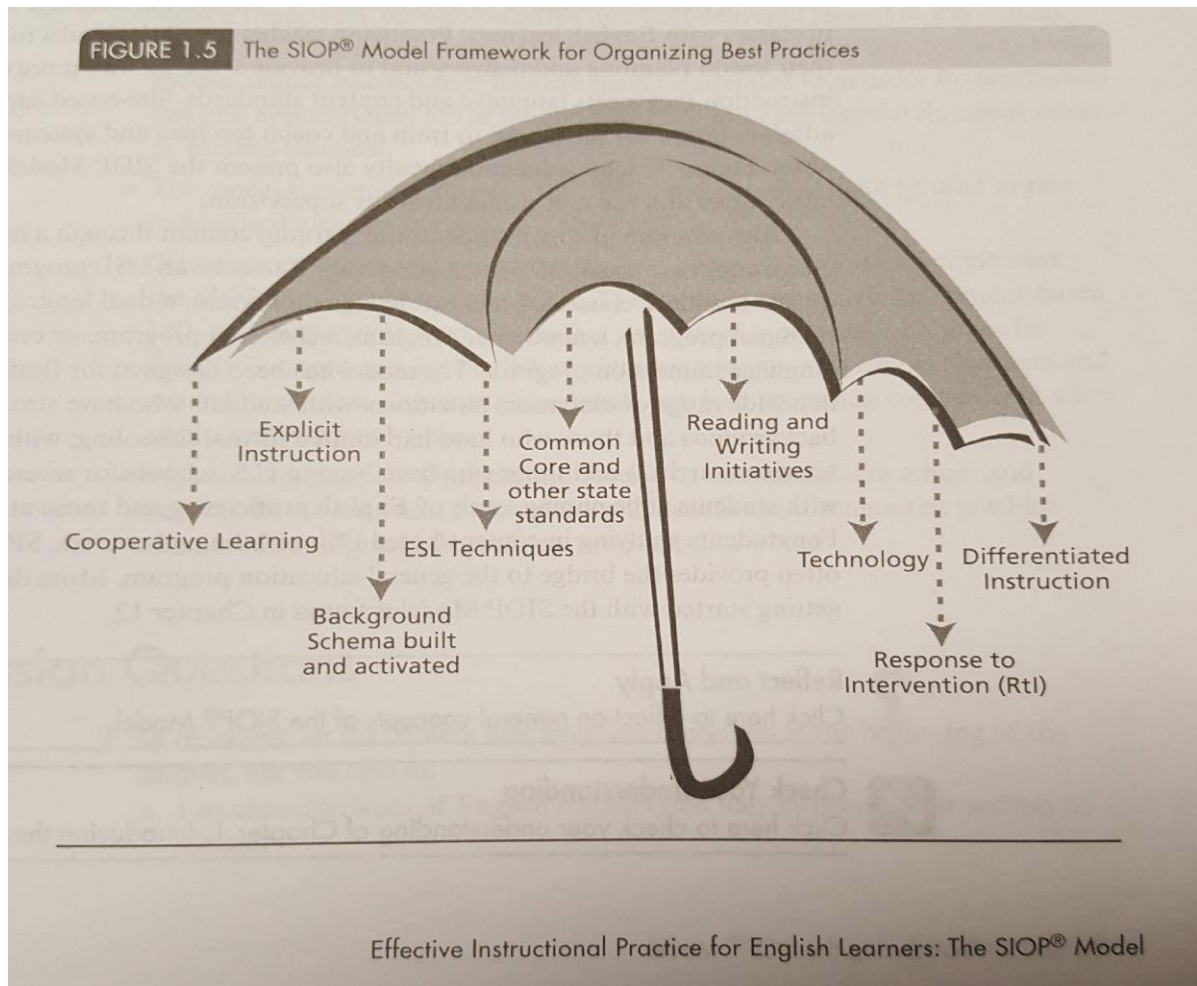
If you are using a rubric to evaluate a product, such as an essay or project, be certain that the criteria upon which the product will be judged are clear, objective, and measurable. Also, be sure students have received a copy of the rubric. Please refer to the illustration below as you construct your rubric. A description of the component to be measured typically appears down the left column¹. Qualifiers and points are usually written along the top row². Indicator of quality (or descriptors) to quantify the quality of work are typically written within the table. The clearly defined indicator of quality for the quality of work are within each box on the matrix³. Alternative rubric formats will be accepted as long as the criteria used for judging is clear, objective, and measurable. LEAP 2025/EOC and textbooks (district adopted) rubrics are acceptable.
