

Vacancy Projections:

As the district begins preparing for vacancies for the 2018-2019 school year, it's important to share anticipated staffing changes with your Staffing Coordinator; this includes pending retirements and Title I staffing changes. If a teacher has informed you that he/she plans to resign at the end of the school year, please have the person contact your Staffing Coordinator to receive information on completing that process. The district has an official resignation form for employees to complete. For your convenience, please see attachment. Tuition Reimbursement:

The JPPSS Office of Human Resources will host a Tuition Reimbursement meeting on **April 25** from 4:30 - 6:00 p.m. at the JPPSS Administration Building at 501 Manhattan Blvd. JPPSS Tuition Reimbursement Program is a federally funded program designed to provide tuition assistance to JPPSS teachers who want to gain teacher certification or add a critical shortage certification to their current Louisiana teaching certificate.

2018-2019 Voluntary Transfer Process:

The district conducts a Voluntary Transfer Process (VTP) each year in the spring. A survey was sent to school administrators to select the date for this year's Voluntary Transfer window. Based on the survey results, the 2018-2019 Voluntary Transfer Process will take place **April 9 - June 7**. There will not be a second transfer window in July. Any employee who desires to transfer must apply online between **April 9 - May 25**. The application window will close at midnight on **May 25**. All transfer mutual consents must be received in Human Resources by 4:00 p.m. on **June 7**.

Certificated teachers, deans, assistant principals, counselors, and para-professionals are eligible for transfer if they:

- Have a minimum of 2 years of experience in JPPSS at their current school
- Hold a valid Louisiana teacher certificate in the requested subject-area vacancy (teachers only)
- Are currently NOT on any level of an Intensive Assistance Plan (IAP)

When: **March 3** from 8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.

Who: Teachers of 6 - 12 grades (lessons can be scaled down to suit educator needs.)

Cost: Free (A \$25.00 registration deposit is due at the time of registration. This deposit will reserve your space for the workshop and will be returned upon full-day participation in the workshop.)

Educators are invited to join NOAA OER staff to learn more about the importance of ocean

exploration, current exploration technologies, and recent deep-sea discoveries. This full day Professional Development workshop will introduce standards-based, hands-on activities and other resources that guide classroom teaching and learning. Ocean health, unique underwater habitats, underwater mapping and remotely-operated vehicles are just a few of the topics to be addressed. Registration is required and space is limited. Educators will receive the NOAA Ship Okeanos Explorer Education Materials Collection Volume 1: Why Do We Explore? and Volume 2: How Do We Explore?, additional resources, a NOAA Ocean Exploration Certificate of Participation, continental breakfast, lunch, and a \$75 stipend. Lessons are designed for grades 6-12 but many activities can be scaled to suit educator needs.

Tulane Science Scholars Program

Tulane University invites bright current grade 10 and 11 students (in addition to exceptional grade 9 students) to take 3-credit college courses during the summer with professors in the School of Science and Engineering. The Tulane Science Scholars Program (TSSP) is a selective program for high school students who have exceptional talent in the sciences and mathematics. TSSP is a residential program and students will have the option to live on campus in a dormitory for an additional fee. This year's summer program includes nine courses: Chemical Engineering, Computer Science, Computers and Musical Creativity, Engineering Design, Intro to MakerSpace, Materials Science and Engineering, Neuroscience, Plants and Human Affairs, and Psychology.

More detailed information about these courses and how to apply is available at <http://tssp.tulane.edu>. Each of the courses is offered for three hours of Tulane credit (may be transferable to another university) and has a \$1500 tuition for LA residents and \$1700 for out-of-state residents. Financial need-based tuition scholarships are available. A separate application is required and will be sent upon request after the general application has been submitted.

The deadline to apply is **March 19** and students will be notified of acceptance in **April**.

New Federal Tax Rates February 2018

With the passage of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017, the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) recently released the new federal tax withholding tables effective for 2018. The new tax tables impact the amount of federal taxes withheld per paycheck.

This outlines our ACT prep plan. If you teach upper classmen, please read this email carefully as it contains action items for you.

1. 8 MINUTE BLASTS

All teachers should be using 8 minute blast time specifically for ACT prep

Core teachers:

Suggested Format:

- Pick 2-4 content specific ACT questions per day
- Have students attempt the questions
- Have students discuss how they were able to arrive at the correct answer
- Highlight any common pitfalls or helpful strategies that would be applicable to similar ACT questions

If you need help finding additional resources, please reach out to Mr. Butler.

Electives teachers (where classes are predominantly upperclassmen) - Please use the 8 minutes to cover ACT vocabulary. See the bottom of this page for resources if you want to make this your own (make it into a competition, utilize activities, give short quizzes etc.)

2. TUTORING Please encourage your students to attend any tutoring you will be holding.

3. QUESTION OF THE DAY- Students pick up a question of the day on their way in. They should complete the problem and drop it into the box in the library. Students who correctly answer the question will be entered in a raffle.

4. SATURDAY SESSIONS There will be a prep session held February 24th, March 3rd and March 17th from 9-12 pm. Students will cycle through a rotation of math, science, and English/reading. Food and prizes will be offered



Communications via Phone

Many of us use our cell phones to contact parents/guardians. Many of us don't want others to have that private access to us. Both are valid approaches.

There is, however, a great solution....**GOOGLE VOICE**. I use it nearly every day, and it works beautifully. Rather than write a lengthy explanation, read the benefits here:

In a nutshell, it gives me phone and text message access to parents, and my phone number remains anonymous. In fact, you can choose a phone number in any area code when you set up the account. When I call or text, it scrambles my number, even though I'm using the service from my personal cell phone and/or computer. If I need to contact a Spanish-speaking parent, I construct a simple message on translate.google.com and paste that into a text message. Parents respond in Spanish and I "decode" by putting their message into the same translation program. It works well, and allows for easy and convenient communication with parents. While we may not have time to track down parents with calls during planning periods, we often find time to send a quick text message when necessary.

End of the year testing is rapidly approaching. In order to ensure that students and teachers have adequate preparation time, the last day for field trips is Friday, March 30, 2018. The deadline for any field trip requests is Friday, March 16, 2018. Any field trip requests submitted after this date cannot be approved.

If you received this email, either you, your paraprofessionals or your students (or all three, in most cases) are going on the Freshmen Field Trip. Unfortunately, Mr. Summers has been tapped for testing, but we will bring his paraprofessionals and students.

Freshman Field Trip – W. Price

We are now up to 24 teachers and about 6 paraprofessionals that will be attending our Freshmen field trip to the Audubon Zoo on Tuesday, March 20th.

Here are some details:

1. We WANT EVERYONE TO ATTEND. Those who don't return a permission slip will be staying behind and working on an EXTENSIVE PACKET of work while being housed in one location all day. **DO NOT TELL THEM THEY CAN STAY HOME!** If you think that a student is not deserving of the opportunity, make notes on the permission form in the appropriate area in the box that each teacher must sign. (I'll contact department heads for some work to leave behind, unless any of you have some good work you can send my way.)
2. I will deliver field trip permission forms on Monday, during Block 1. Be prepared to tell me how many freshmen you have on your roster when I come around. I have printed them in English AND Spanish. If any other language (Chinese or Arabic) is needed, let me know. I have access to those languages, as well.
3. Students will have 8 days to return their field trip forms and money. (Yes! We will accept late payments, but we don't want that publicized to students. Encourage their compliance by 3-14-18, please.)
4. Math teachers (Ms. Jones, Ms. Harris and Mr. Setzer) will be collecting funds and writing receipts. The cost of the trip is \$5.00 per student. THANK YOU, MATH TEACHERS!!
5. Reinforce that they MUST bring money for food, as no lunches will be brought from school. We can't bring food into the zoo, and we can't leave items on the buses all day. I'll get a menu and prices that we can share with kids, but I don't expect they'll need more than \$10-20, depending on how much they eat. We do get discounted prices!
6. We will need CHAPERONES!! Invite your significant other, adult siblings, parents, in-laws, or energetic and patient friends. Let's try to get chaperones that WE KNOW! If students ask whether their parents can come, tell them we will let them know whether we need additional chaperones. I'll follow-up on that after we see how many of your friends and family want to spend time with us. Please send me an email with the names, and relationship to you, of adults you recruit. We do have to cap the chaperones, so the sooner you get the names to me, the sooner I can finalize the list of adults who will attend.

DON'T GET SUED!!

As a teacher, could you face personal liability in a school-related lawsuit? For most professional educators, the answer is simple: Your risk is minimal if you exercise common sense and good judgment. However, the issue of teacher and school liability in today's litigious society tells us that anyone can be subject to a lawsuit. The professional teacher should be educated as to his/her liability in the classroom, and be mindful of how to minimize exposure to lawsuits and student/parent complaints.

In a school setting, the duty a teacher owes to students is a foregone conclusion that is summarized in the legal doctrine of "In Loco Parentis." Literally defined as "in the place of the parents," this legal theory has historically been used to justify the power and authority that school officials have over students. At the same time, this theory accounts for a heightened degree of responsibility for the care and well being of students under the control of a teacher, just as if the teacher were acting in the capacity of a parent. The student/teacher relationship by definition is a special relationship.

Teachers have a duty to anticipate foreseeable dangers to students and to take steps to minimize those dangers. Specifically, a teacher's duties always include the following broad elements: adequate student supervision; responsibility to report the need for maintenance of equipment and facilities; heightened supervision of high-risk activities; or looking after the well being of students with special needs. In most negligence cases brought against teachers, the duty element is easily proven.
