## **Human Resources**

### **Vacancy Projections:**

As the district begins preparing for vacancies for the 2018-2019 school year, it's important to share anticipated staffing changes with your Staffing Coordinator; this includes pending retirements and Title I staffing changes. If a teacher has informed you that he/she plans to resign at the end of the school year, please have the person contact your Staffing Coordinator to receive information on completing that process. The district has an official resignation form for employees to complete. For your convenience, please see attachment. The resignation form is also available on the Human Resources web page: <http://jpschools.org/departments/human-capital/>. All resignation forms must go to the Staffing Coordinator. Please send Central Office and Warehouse resignation forms to Evonne Mitchell.

### **Tuition Reimbursement:**

The JPPSS Office of Human Resources will host a Tuition Reimbursement meeting on **April 25** from 4:30 - 6:00 p.m. at the JPPSS Administration Building at 501 Manhattan Blvd. JPPSS Tuition Reimbursement Program is a federally funded program designed to provide tuition assistance to JPPSS teachers who want to gain teacher certification or add a critical shortage certification to their current Louisiana teaching certificate.

### **2018-2019 Voluntary Transfer Process:**

The district conducts a Voluntary Transfer Process (VTP) each year in the spring. A survey was sent to school administrators to select the date for this year's Voluntary Transfer window. Based on the survey results, the 2018-2019 Voluntary Transfer Process will take place **April 9 - June 7**. There will not be a second transfer window in July. Any employee who desires to transfer must apply online between **April 9 - May 25**. The application window will close at midnight on **May 25**. All transfer mutual consents must be received in Human Resources by 4:00 p.m. on **June 7**.

Certificated teachers, deans, assistant principals, counselors, and para-professionals are eligible for transfer if they:

- Have a minimum of 2 years of experience in JPPSS at their current school
- Hold a valid Louisiana teacher certificate in the requested subject-area vacancy (teachers only)
- Are currently NOT on any level of an Intensive Assistance Plan (IAP)

### **Tulane Science Scholars Program**

Tulane University invites bright current grade 10 and 11 students (in addition to exceptional grade 9 students) to take 3-credit college courses during the summer with professors in the School of Science and Engineering. The Tulane Science Scholars Program (TSSP) is a selective program for high school students who have exceptional talent in the sciences and mathematics. TSSP is a residential program and students will have the option to live on campus in a dormitory for an additional fee. This year's summer program includes nine courses: Chemical Engineering, Computer Science, Computers and Musical Creativity, Engineering Design, Intro to MakerSpace, Materials Science and Engineering, Neuroscience, Plants and Human Affairs, and Psychology.

Each of the courses is offered for three hours of Tulane credit (may be transferable to another university) and has a \$1500 tuition for LA residents and \$1700 for out-of-state residents. 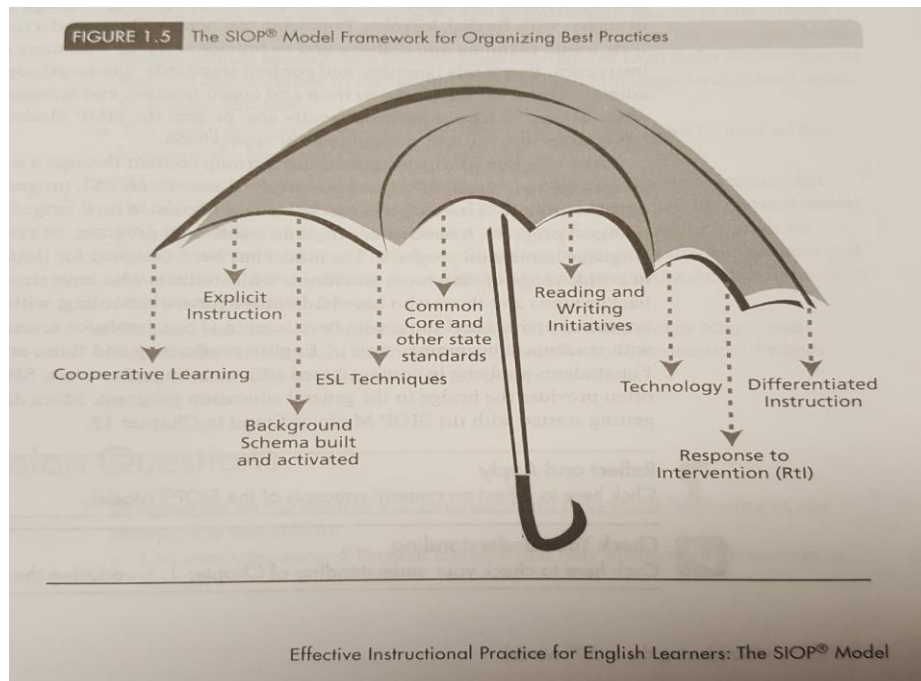

## School Law: Safe Haven Law Instruction Requirements

Louisiana R.S. 17:81 requires the district to inform high school students of the Safe Haven law. The specific law can be found in Chapter 13, Articles 1149 – 1160 of the *Louisiana Children's Code*. The Safe Haven Law, enacted April 2000, gives parents a mechanism to safely and anonymously relinquish the care of their newborn to the state without fear of prosecution. The following criteria must be met in order to qualify as a Safe Haven Relinquishment:

- The infant must be less than 60 days old.
- The infant has not been a victim of abuse or neglect.
- The infant must be relinquished to an employee at a designated Safe Haven facility.

Within Safe Haven instruction, high schools are required to deliver the following information:

**Art. 1151. Relinquishment of infants; defense to prosecution**

A. If a parent wishes to relinquish his infant, he may leave the infant in the care of any employee of a designated emergency care facility. If the parent is unable to travel to such a facility, he may call "911," and a law enforcement officer or emergency medical service provider shall immediately be dispatched to meet the parent and transport the child to a hospital.

B. Relinquishment of an infant in accordance with this Chapter is not a criminal act of neglect, abandonment, cruelty, or a crime against the child.

**Art. 1152. Designated emergency care facility responsibilities**

Process of relinquishing the infant with the intent of forfeiting parental responsibilities:

1. Go to the nearest Safe Haven facility (licensed hospitals, public health units, emergency medical service providers, medical clinics, fire stations, police stations, pregnancy crisis centers, child advocacy centers).

2. Give the infant to an employee at the facility. Parents should tell the employee that they want to utilize the Safe Haven Law.
3. An employee will offer the parent a card with a toll-free number, **1-800-CHILDREN (1-800-244-5373)**, to call if the parent wants to give medical information about the infant or if they want to learn about their parental rights.

**Art. 1153. Medical evaluation of the infant**

Process for an infant that has been relinquished to a Safe Haven location:

1. The baby will be brought to the nearest medical facility for a health assessment and to receive any necessary medical care.
2. The Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) will find a family to care for the baby. DCFS will begin proceedings to obtain custody of the child and safely and legally place the baby in a permanent adoptive family.

**Art. 1156. Reclaiming parental rights; time limitations**

Within thirty days after the relinquishment, a parent who has relinquished an infant may seek to reclaim parental rights by filing in the court, in the parish in which the infant was relinquished, a motion evidencing a declaration of his intention to retain his parental rights.

In order to fulfill the requirements of this law, JPPSS high schools must teach the Safe Haven Law by conveying the aforementioned points. The state statute requires that age-appropriate instruction regarding Louisiana's Safe Haven Law occurs within health, family/consumer science, physical education, or science class.

To ensure that this information has been communicated, the principal will complete a Safe Haven Attestation form. *The attestation form should be returned to Jennifer Bodenheimer in the Academics Department by **March 29, 2018.***
