DEPARTMENTAL TUTORING SCHEDULE

All departments are required to offering tutoring after school. Each content area within a department should offer tutoring at least one day per week. GOOGLE CLASSROOM TRAINING

MANDATED REPORTER TRAINING

All school employees are federally designated as mandated reporters. In compliance with ACT 126, each year all school employees must complete mandated reporter training. Look for an email this week from Ms. McCabe with instructions for completing this training.

It's our "Duty" to do our "Duty"

Teachers and staff member is responsible for the safety and well-being of students and staff; therefore, everyone should report to their respective duty assignments everyday and on time.

Tardy Procedures

It is imperative that teachers impress upon students the need to be in class during the entire instructional period. As part of your Blackboard Configuration, you should clearly specify the time spent on each segment of your lesson. In the morning, students should be admitted to class without a pass until 7:25; however, students should be marked tardy in JCampus after 7:20. Students who are consistently tardy during the first minutes of class, when the warmup or the initial formative assessment occurs, miss out on critical information needed to successfully complete the lesson objective for the day. Under no circumstance should you delay your lesson activities because students arrive to your class late. If multiple students are arriving late everyday, then this a matter that must be addressed with an administrator, as it may also require a closer look at your classroom management plan. Please don't hesitate to see me should you have any questions.

Students and teachers are not permitted to share common restroom and dressing facilities. It has come to our attention that students are being allowed to access faculty restrooms by some teachers. These teachers are putting our colleagues in a very serious situation. FIRST AID FOR SICK AND INJURED STUDENTS

Please refrain from sending students directly to the nurse. When a student is injured or ill, the teacher should contact the office for an administrator. Contact the front office for a nurse only for severe medical issues and conditions. Sending sick or injured students out of class unsupervised may lead to unsafe situations for the student. Students are not allowed to take medication without medical supervision which would have been determined by a doctor's order and a consultation with the school nurse and the student's parent. Under no circumstance should a student be allowed to consume medication, either controlled or over the counter, on campus. Contact the front office immediately if you suspect that a student has in their possession, shared, or has consumed medication on campus. We do not have a health center that treats runny noses, headaches or upset stomachs.



FACT SHEET FOR FAMILIES AND SCHOOL STAFF: LIMITATIONS ON DHS IMMIGRATION ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS AT SENSITIVE LOCATIONS

All children have a right to a free public education, regardless of their actual or perceived immigration or citizenship status or that of their parents.¹ Education leaders, teachers, students, and families, have asked questions about guidance that was released by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) that limits immigration enforcement actions from occurring at schools and other "sensitive locations." This DHS guidance is at: <https://www.cbp.gov/border-security/sensitive-locations-faq>. To respond to those questions, the U.S. Department of Education has worked with DHS to prepare this fact sheet, intended to help parents, families, educators, and other school staff understand the DHS guidance.

In general, DHS has explained that immigration enforcement actions may **not** occur at or in "sensitive locations."²

These locations include:



Schools, such as known and licensed daycares, pre-schools and other early learning programs; primary schools; secondary schools; post-secondary schools up to and including colleges and universities; as well as scholastic or education-related activities or events.



School bus stops that are marked and/or known to the officer, during periods when children are present at the stop.



Medical treatment and health care facilities, such as hospitals, doctor's offices, accredited health clinics, and emergent or urgent care facilities.



Places of worship, such as churches, synagogues, mosques, and temples.



Religious or civil ceremonies or observances, such as funerals and weddings.



During public demonstrations, such as a march, rally, or parade.



Will enforcement actions ever occur at sensitive locations?

DHS has explained that immigration enforcement actions may occur at sensitive locations in limited circumstances, but should generally be avoided. DHS officers and agents from U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) or U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) may conduct an enforcement action at a sensitive location only with prior approval from an appropriate supervisory DHS official, or if the enforcement action involves exigent circumstances related to national security, terrorism, or public safety, or where there is imminent risk of destruction of evidence material to an ongoing criminal case.

What should I do if I believe an enforcement action has taken place that is inconsistent with this guidance?

DHS has explained that there are a number of locations where an individual may lodge a complaint with DHS about a particular immigration enforcement action that may have taken place in violation of these or other policies. Where should I report discrimination if I believe it is taking place in my school?

Anyone with information about discrimination occurring in schools, including discrimination on the basis of race, color, or national origin (which may include citizenship or immigration status), may file a complaint by contacting the U.S. Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights via www.ed.gov/ocr, ocr@ed.gov, 800-421-3481 or TDD: 800-877-8339 (for language assistance contact 800-USA-LEARN (800-872-5327)) or by contacting the U.S. Department of Justice, Civil Rights Division, Educational Opportunities Section via www.justice.gov/crt/edo, education@udoj.gov, 877-292-3804, or TTY: 800-514-0383.
